- ◆ Canosia Township was officially organized in 1888! That's over 130 years of history!
- ◆ The Canosia Town Hall has a long history all of it's own!
- ◆ There are four lakes in Canosia Township (even if just a small part).



- ◆ There used to be a school at the corner of Martin and Lavaque Roads.
- ◆ Canosia Township's growth through the early years was slow and steady. There were 205 persons in 1905, increasing to 242 in 1910, and up to 311 in 1920. The populations wouldn't dramatically increase until 1950.
